III. **6:00 p.m. PUBLIC HEARING** Releasing and expending money from the Drake Field School Fund - \$7500 plus \$2000 - site work, plumbing and install meter at Drake field so water connection by Pennichuck is legal and billable to the School District. Apparently, in prior years, water was on and used at bathrooms by dugout but no bill was ever issued by Pennichuck to the School District. When Pennichuck just became aware, they shut off the water and provided information to the School District as to what needs to take place to make the water connection. The School Board has received one estimate from Forcier, so the school has ballpark costs, they work with Pennichuck. Eric suggested Earth as a second quote.

IX. PES PRINCIPAL – Mrs. White-

2 Retirements at PES, Michael Curtin over 29 years of service - he is still helping us even after he has retired. Christy Hinckley, Student Services Center, 28 years - students biggest cheerleader.

Summer Slide - activities with students, reading or math - teamed up with school librarian and students designed their own summer challenge. In fall, 2nd annual kickball game.

Dusty Durant -Admin Assistant went to I love you guys training - creating reunification plans. Day ended with a simulation of reunification.

Librarian circulated 9976 books - each student took out 44.76 books on average. The walk a thon raised enough money to donate \$4000 to the library - also received Globe grant.

XI. PMHS ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL – Mrs. Brown

NH Scholars - very proud to report 7 seniors, 22% of the graduates earned this distinction.

Guidance Dept work with students and look at their schedule freshman year-encouraging NH Scholars, showing them course of study and career path. We fill this out with the students and follow them for 4 years. Biggest barrier is - language arts piece, their only option is to take foreign language online. Need 4th year of math and PMHS only offers 3.

Scholarships and Free Application available to NH Scholars.

Master Schedule has been completed. Cannot hand out to students due to open positions.

Gear Up Program - fully funded grant position - we are guaranteed this position till Sept 30th.

We took Middle School Students to CRTC. There are several field trips this summer being offered.

Open Enrollment update-waiting for update from Attorney Barbara Loughman.

Drake Field Issues-in addition to getting monies for water from Pennichuck. Culvert to the river was undermined and had a big hole, someone fixed it. Eric will call Derek and have this added to the Pennichuck water work. Lori - asked what is the goal? Timing? Balloon Rally. If not done in time, there would be no running water for vendors at the Balloon Rally. Board discussed the time frame from contractors-can they get this done by Balloon Rally. Derek mentioned that Rotary gave back to make up for water use in the past. Did projects to upgrade equipment etc.
